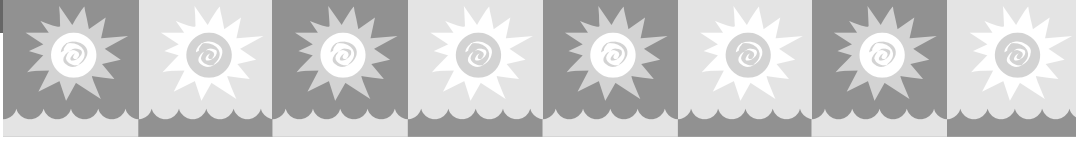

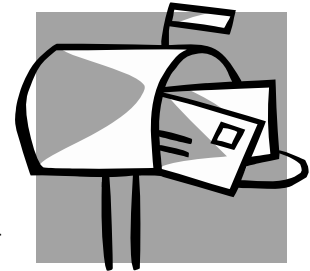
PRESIDENT'S LETTER

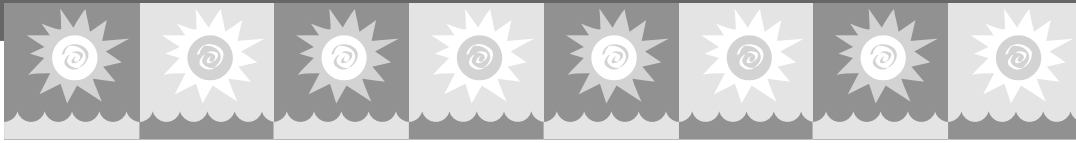


The award will consist of a dinner out with spouse or date, a write up in the newsletter, and all of our sincere thanks and appreciation.

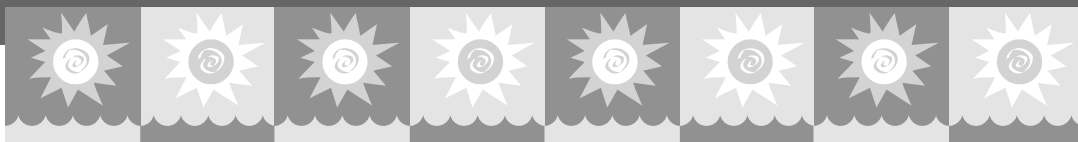

KIDS BUNCO AT THE POOL

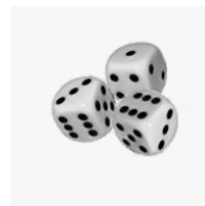
Do your kids want to play Bunco when it's your turn to host? Here's a chance for them to satisfy their Bunco yearning!

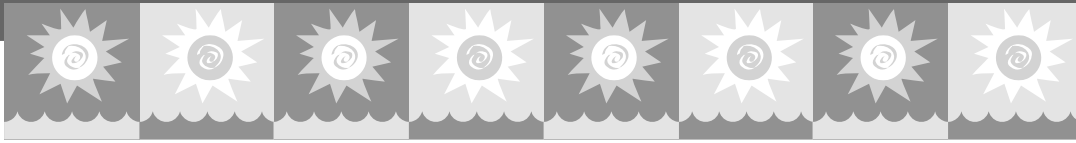
Two important rules: Swimmers cannot swim or eat during game time and children under the age of 14 cannot be **dropped off** to play!

DEVEREAUX POOL HOUSE RENOVATION UPDATE

The pool house renovation project is continuing and we hope to have the pool open soon.

The schedule is tight, but Inland will be completing the epoxy floors the weekend of May 8-10. Plumbing and electrical work will follow and be complete by May 14th. The ADT security system has been reinstalled and ADT is scheduled to be on site May 11th to ensure all is operating correctly. The new rules for skimmers and drain covers have been checked and the paper work has been submitted. At this time, the additional shade structure and extended hours lighting have been put on hold and should be completed later this summer or next off season.

The original schedule was delayed significantly in the permitting process and all involved felt it was imperative to get the pool open ASAP. For that reason, we decided to remove these tasks and not risk that work jeopardizing the pool opening.

The Town of Cary CO inspection is scheduled on May 14th and we are aiming for Wake County's pool inspection at the end of that week also. Keep your fingers crossed and hopefully we will all be enjoying the pool soon.

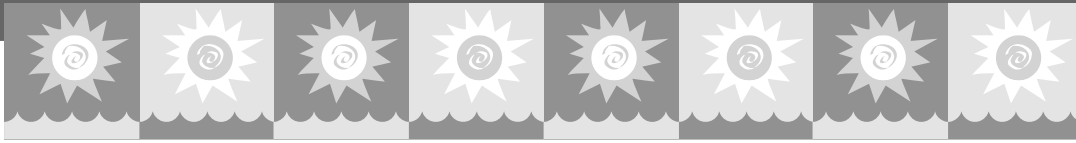
The cars that were built were very creative- I hope that the parents and children had lots of fun building their cars- and even Grandparents who helped too.

2009 DEVIL RAYS POOL USAGE SCHEDULE

The 2009 Devil Ray swim season has begun. The swim team calendar was included in the last newsletter, and has also been posted to Yahoo Groups. We are running the usage schedule and info below again for everyone's information.

Congratulations to the Devil Rays on their 2008 season finish as Southern League Division 5 Champions. In 2009, the Devil Rays have moved up to Division 4, and are ranked 15 out of 37 teams in the Southern League. Let's Go Devil Rays!

Season duration: First practice Monday, May 18th. Last meet Tuesday, July 21st.

Practice schedule: Mon – Thurs 6-8pm, and Sat 9-10am. There will be occasional days within this time that practice will not be held. The schedule, and any updates to the schedule, would be posted to Yahoo Groups, and at the pool house.

Meet schedule: Tuesday's beginning 6/16 and ending 7/21. Three of these meets would be held at the Devereaux pool, and three would be at our competitor's pool (exact dates will be known in April). On home meet dates, the pool would need to close at 4pm. On away meet dates, the pool would be open to the community. Sat June 6 8am to noon time trial.

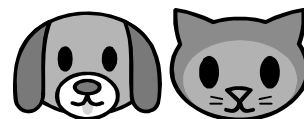
Team size: Last year there were 100+ kids that participated on the Devil Ray team. We expect an increase in number this year. This is a lot of kids to have in a pool our size, and we did our best to work with as little lane space as safely possible and still leave some space for open community swimming.

As we did last year, we would be sensitive to the community need. We would leave the baby pool area and one lane open for community swimming during practice. Depending on practice attendance, we would make a second lane available whenever possible. We would also ask Devil Rays who showed up early for their scheduled practice time to stay out of the open swim area.

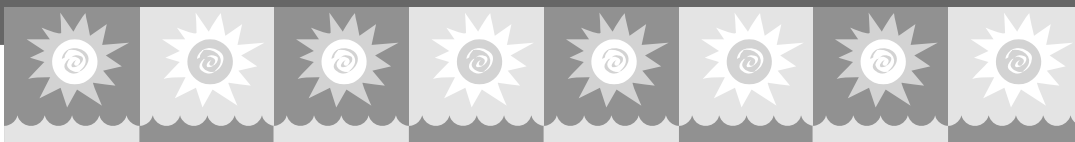
REMINDER: PET LAWS IN NC & CARY

Leash Law: One way to prevent your animal from biting a person or another animal is to obey the leash law. The Town of Cary requires that all dogs and cats be on a leash or lead if they are not on the owner's property. The leash law also protects animals from injury.

Rabies: North Carolina law requires dogs and cats to be vaccinated against rabies. Not only does this protect them, but if they are protected against rabies, you will be too. Veterinarians can vaccinate your dog or cat against rabies.



Pet Tags: All dogs and cats 4 months of age and older within the jurisdiction of the Town of Cary are required to wear a pet tag. If your pet becomes lost and animal control locates it, information on the ownership of the animal is quickly obtained by checking the pet tag number with computer records. Pet tags may be obtained for a one-time fee of \$20.00 for animals that have not been neutered or spayed and \$10.00 for animals that have been neutered or spayed. You must provide proof from your veterinarian that this operation has been performed. Acceptable forms of proof are either a copy of the bill for the operation or your veterinarian's signature on the pet tag application form.



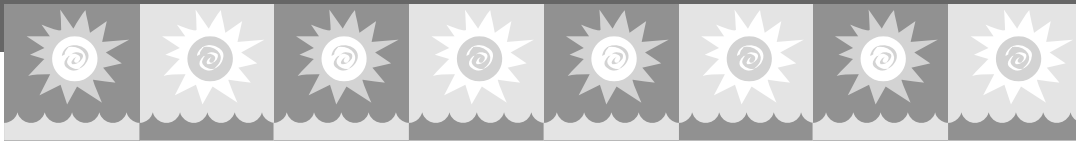
GOOD NEWS FROM AROUND THE NEIGHBORHOOD

WHAT IS A POOL PARTY

Any time you have 10 guests and want to set aside some tables! If you want to make sure that you have the right to use and reserve tables for a pool party, you must fill out a pool party form and submit it beforehand! The pool party form is located on our Devereaux website, and we also have forms in a binder at the pool.

- A \$50.00 dollar refundable deposit for damages will be required for groups using the pool facility. In the event that we have to pay the pool attendant to clean after your party, this money will be used to pay the attendant, and it will not be refunded. This can also be used to pay for any damages will be the liability of the resident making the request. (So, please clean up and be careful!)
- Requests and deposit are to be given to Patti Fiette @ 363-2886 – 313 Wedgemere Street - 10 days prior to the party date.
- Use of the grills will be allowed if requested. You are responsible to ensure all items and floors, garbage, etc., are cleaned after your party.
- All "Pool Rules" apply to the group.
- No balloons are allowed in the pool deck area.
- The gate is not to be propped open, you are required to meet your guests and let them in.
- The hosting resident is responsible for clean-up of all the pool facilities after the party.
- Trash cans need to be emptied in the larger green cans for curb pick-up, trash bags replaced and kitchen cleaned.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** if conditions exist that require the pool to be closed, please have a back up plan.
- **The pool will remain open to Devereaux Residents during this party.**
- After the party, the area will be inspected and your deposit will be returned

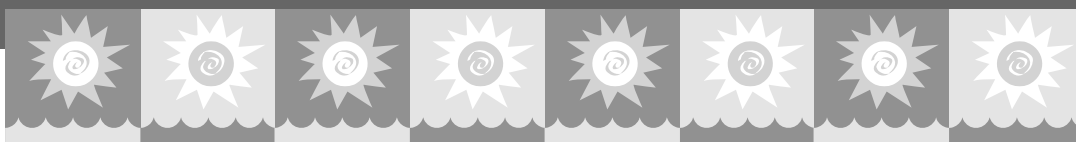
ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE REPORT

1. All requests for architectural approval must be sent directly to Omega Management Company. This procedure is by order of the HOA Board.
2. Omega will send the request on to Mrs. Pat Ward, ACC Chairperson
3. After screening for all required information, Pat will email the request to the rest of the committee. If any information is missing, Pat will call the HO.
4. The committee members will email their votes to Pat.
5. Pat will call the home owner with their decision. The management company will be notified and a letter with the decision will be sent to the homeowner.

Since email is being used for communication, please make sure all words, architectural drawings are dark and able to be read. Recent requests have been delayed as the committee could not see the lines, numbers etc. Be sure to include a site plan with the changes noted on the plan. It is not necessary to submit a site plan if requesting a paint change. Neighbors next door, nearby (backyard) etc need to sign the request. The HO making the request is informing them of any change. They can express an opinion to the ACC committee, should they desire.

No HO can or should start a project without ACC approval. Check the covenants or call Pat or Omega.
